Dear Sir:

The data which follow were obtained from papers on file in the pension claim, S. 40487, based on the military service of William Spencer.

The date and place of his birth and the names of his parents were not given.

Wheeling, he enlisted, date not given, and served nine or twelve months as private with the Virginia troops under Captain Barret and Colonel Buford; he was in the Indian battles of Ligonier and Shawnestowns and aided in reclaiming five hundred and eighty four white men, women and prisoners and brought them back to Fort Pitt. He enlisted in the fall of 1776 in Captain Hugh Stinson's company in Colonel William Crawford's regiment, was in the battle of Sandusky, was wounded in the breast and shoulder in the battle of Brush River in Pennsylvania and served until the close of the Revolution. He also served two years on the Ohio River under Generals Wayne and Wilkinson, no details of this service given.

On account of his service in the Revolution, William Spencer was allowed pension on his application executed July 27, 1818, at which time he was living in Clinton County, Ohio.

In 1818 he stated that he was about seventy-five years of age in 1819 he stated he was seventy years of age and in 1820 that he was about ninety years of age.

William Spencer died September 11, 1833.

In 1820 William Spencer referred to his wife but did not give her name.

In 1819 a son, John, testified in Ohio in behalf of his father and stated that he was about nine years of age when his father entered the service.

The papers in this claim contain no further data relative to the family of William Spencer.
